1.4.2 - How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the (maximum 500 words)

Feedback Obtained

The students fill up the feedback forms and the rigorous analysis was done. Through these feedback forms the infrastructural facilities like smart classroom, enhancement in basic facilities were taken care. Administrative staff dissatisfaction was seen by students and the institution management recruited the staff to facilitate and address students' administrative issues. The teacher's satisfaction level of the administrative process reported low and teachers made attempts to chipping in the administrative process. The failure to provide the administrative staff by the state Government has caused these problems. Even though the management and college has taken care by their own fund. Past pupils and the parents give their feedbacks on annual day. The feedbacks are analysed and prior suggestions are taken up as and when financial provisions have supported to accomplish the needs. There is an effective feedback mechanism in our institution. Feedback was collected from parents, students, Alumni. Students appraised the faculty based on the criteria generated by the institution. A statistical analysis of this feedback was given to each faculty member so that they could take necessary corrective measures. Feedback was collected by the PTA and submitted to the management for action. Alumni feedback was informally gathered during meetings and suggestions were taken. The evaluation forms were analysed after the collection of the data.
